

The charts show how much local authorities spent on a range of services in Someland in three separate years: 1980, 1990 and 2000.




- The graph below shows the amount of money spent on books in Germany, France, Italy and Austria between 1995 and 2005. Write a report for a university lecturer describing the information below.


The graph shows the increase in population of three counties, Columbia, Yamhill and Washington in the U.S. state of Oregon, between 1940 and 2000.
